**THIS FIVE-BEDROOM ASYMMETRICAL SECOND EMPIRE HOME WAS BUILT IN THE LATE 1800S AND OWNED BY DR. EDWARD C. MILLS, A DENTIST AND UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN GRADUATE, AND HIS WIFE, NELLIE. THE HOME STAYED IN THE MILLS FAMILY THROUGH THE 1940S. IT IS TEXTBOOK SECOND EMPIRE STYLE WITH A CONCAVE MANSARD ROOF AND MOSTLY ITALIANATE DETAILING, EXCEPT FOR THE UNADORNED ARCHED WINDOW THAT WAS A TYPICAL CHARACTERISTIC. THE PORCH WAS NOT ORIGINAL AND WAS ADDED LATER. THE HOUSE WOULD HAVE BEEN CONSIDERED MODERN IN THE LATE 1800S AND WAS A BREAK FROM THE ROMANTIC CLASSICISM OF THE TIME. THE BUILDING IS VACANT AND DETERIORATING.**
